

Hominy Baptist Church Missions Partners

International and National Missions

- Cooperative Baptist Fellowship 20%
Cooperative Baptists are partnering to renew God's world. God calls us and equips us to spread the hope of Jesus Christ to the least evangelized, most marginalized people on earth. CBF is home to 1,800 churches and thousands of individuals, along with 18 state and regional organizations, more than 750 endorsed chaplains and pastoral counselors, nearly 50 ministry partners – including partnerships with 14 seminaries and theology schools – and 125 field personnel serving in more than 30 countries around the world.
- Associated Baptist Press (Baptist News Global) 2%
Baptist News Global is an autonomous, nonprofit news organization that offers news, features, and commentary for a global audience of Baptists and other Christians. [Baptist News Global](#) is the result of a merger of Associated Baptist Press, founded in 1990 as the only independent news service created by and for Baptists, and The Religious Herald, founded in 1828 as the voice of Baptists in Virginia and the Mid-Atlantic.
- Baptist Women in Ministry NC 2%
Baptist Women in Ministry NC provides a network of support, fellowship, worship, advocacy and education for Baptist women and men who are seeking to honor God's call in Christ to women in all areas of mission and ministry, for the purpose of increasing understanding and awareness of our calling as women and men in Christ. BWIMNC awards four \$1000 scholarships annually to female ministerial students enrolled in North Carolina Baptist institutions
- Baptist Joint Committee For Religious Liberty 2%
The Baptist Joint Committee is the only faith-based agency devoted solely to religious liberty and the institutional separation of church and state. Since 1936, the BJC has continuously provided reliable leadership on church-state issues as it leads key coalitions of religious and civil liberties groups striving to protect both the free exercise of religion and to defend against its establishment by government.
- The Emmanuel McCall Racial Equity Fund 2%
The purpose of the Dr. Emmanuel McCall Racial Justice and Leadership Initiative is to create avenues for God's imperfect church to move toward meaningful unity between racially diverse communities.

State and Regional Missions

- North Carolina Cooperative Baptist Fellowship 11%
North Carolina CBF is a fellowship of Baptists in North Carolina sharing a commitment to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, preserving historic Baptist freedoms and calling out God's gifts in Christians and churches to engage in Christ-centered ministry in our state and around the world. The mission is to Bring Baptists of North Carolina together for Christ-centered ministry.
- Western North Carolina Baptist Fellowship 10%
The Western North Carolina Baptist Fellowship is a voluntary fellowship of moderate Baptist churches in and around the mountains of Western North Carolina. The Fellowship began with a gathering of 178 people meeting at Hominy Baptist Church on November 25, 2002. Eleven churches were represented. Today, there are 19 churches across WNC cooperating with a vision to serve Christ and His Kingdom. WNCBF has mission partnerships with WNC Baptist Collegiate Ministry, CBFNC, Nada, Kentucky, Ukraine, Belize, Haiti, and partners locally with member churches in doing missions.
- North Carolina Baptist Children's Home 2%
Financial gifts to Baptist Children's Homes of North Carolina help provide programs and services to children and families in need. Baptist Children's Homes of North Carolina is committed to providing the highest quality care to the children and families they serve. They are one of the premier child care institutions in the state, living out the mission of "helping hurting children... healing broken families."
- North Carolina Baptist Retirement Home 2%
Founded in 1951, Baptist Retirement Homes of North Carolina, Incorporated is one of North Carolina's most respected providers of long term care. With four retirement communities throughout the state, Baptist Retirement Homes of North Carolina, Incorporated provides all levels of care for Older Adults, including special programs for Older Adults with dementia-related disorders like Alzheimer's disease. Baptist Retirement Homes is a not-for-profit, church-related long-term care organization.

Local Missions

- Asheville Buncombe County Christian Ministry (ABCCM) 17%
ABCCM is the primary non-profit organization that addresses poverty, hunger, homelessness and access to health care for the under-served in Buncombe County. Begun as a small collaboration of churches in 1969, ABCCM has played a significant role in meeting emergency assistance needs for families.
- ABCCM Hominy Valley Crisis Ministry 13%
The Crisis Ministry serves the people of Hominy Valley as a walk-in site where provisions are made to help people through a short term crisis when income and resources are insufficient to meet the basic necessities of life such as food, clothes, housing, utilities, and access to medical care.
- Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity 5%
Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity, Inc. is a nonprofit ministry dedicated to building simple, decent houses with community volunteers in partnership with qualified families currently living in inadequate housing. In 2008 Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity completed their 175th house and brought hope, dignity and pride to 16 more local families.
- WNC Baptist Collegiate Ministry 5%
In 2014, area CBF churches, and some non CBF churches, came together to continue campus ministry as WNC Baptist Collegiate Ministry, supporting a campus minister and an intern at UNCA and WCU.
- Transformation Village 5%
ABCCM's vision of taking every single woman, mom with children and intact family off the street or out of a car. ABCCM is building on successful programs that move homeless women and children into stability, training programs and career-level jobs that give residents health, safety and education.
- Mars Hill University 2%
Mars Hill University is a private, four-year liberal arts institution located in the mountains of western North Carolina. Founded in 1856 by Baptist families of the region, including members of Hominy Baptist Church, Mars Hill no longer receives direct funding from the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina. Our gifts go to the Chaplain's Mission Trip fund

Hominy Baptist Ministries

- Community Ministry \$2000.00
Provides funding for emergency assistance to supplement the work of ABCCM and cover individual and family needs that otherwise go unmet.

- DayStay Operating Funds \$12,000.00
DayStay is a unique adult day care program located at Hominy Baptist Church. Its activity-driven program focuses on providing socialization and programs that help participants develop to their greatest potential, while strengthening and improving physical and cognitive abilities. Its diversified program offers a wide range of activities, both for the individual and the group setting.

- Daily Bread \$6,000.00
The Daily Bread ministry of Hominy Baptist Church serves as the Meals on Wheels provider for 24 residents of the Hominy Valley in Buncombe County. Meals are prepared by the Hominy Baptist Church Childcare staff and delivered by church members.

Cuba Mission

Nuevo Ebenezer Baptist Church in Las Tunas, Cuba is our sister church through the Fraternity of Baptist Churches and the Baptist Alliance. We help support Pastor Nereida Oquando and help the church purchase and raise chickens and small livestock that can be distributed as sources of protein (meat and eggs). We send medicines and other supplies with mission teams from our church and other churches in WNCBF.
